- 2'500 municipalities
- 26 cantons
- pending maintenance cases (800 incoming, 750 outgoing requests)

Applicable legislation in Switzerland


Yes New York Convention Hague 2007 Convention Bilateral agreements Hague 2007 Protocol (USA, MoU with some ■ EU Maintenance Canadian provinces) Regulation Hague Conventions 1973, 1956, 1958 Lugano Convention Swiss Federal Code on Private International Law (subsidiary application)

Cooperation (NYC56, incoming requests)

- 1. transmission of documents
- 2. information
- 3. recognition/enforcement of maintenance claims

Application procedure

- Federal organisation
- Role of Swiss central authority/ local authorities

Tasks of the Swiss authorities

- Basic rule: comparable with HC 2007
- Exceptions
 - location of the debtor
 - information concerning income/assets
 - obtention of evidence
 - assistance in establishing parentage
 - service of documents

Recognition and enforcement

- general overview
- specific problems
 - completeness of files/ translation requirements
 - court-ordered directions of debtors
 - per-cent-judgments
